This serene painting will surely trigger memories to come rushing back to those of us that spent time engaged in the Bank Line's Orient – Africa Liner Service.

Koh Si Chiang is a small offshore Island anchorage close to the estuary of the Chao Phraya River in Thailand, close to the township of Sriritcha.

It is primarily used by ships that exceed the maximum draft limitations for the Bangkok Bar, to top off loading after calling at Bangkok, or for lightening operations prior to proceeding upstream to Bangkok Port, hence, all work is conducted using Lighters and is a typically crowded anchorage.
