The Steamer "Straits Breeze" (ex-Kooringa) 3292 GRT, seaward bound after loading a full cargo of logs. Built by Caledon Shipbuilding Co., Dundee, in 1938 for Australian owners. She was equipped with a triple-expansion, exhaust turbine, giving her a service speed of 11 knots. In 1959 the vessel was sold to John Manners & Co., Hong Kong, and renamed "Straits Breeze". In 1965 (still under management of J Manners & Co) she was renamed "San Eduardo". John Manners sold her in 1965 to Teh Foo Navigation Co., who renamed her "Teh Foo". She was sent for demolition at Kaohsiung in March 1968.
